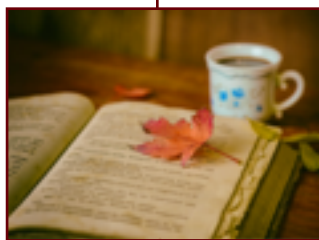
Don't forget to follow the library on Facebook and Instagram to stay up to date on library news and events, and we will see you at the front desk this winter.

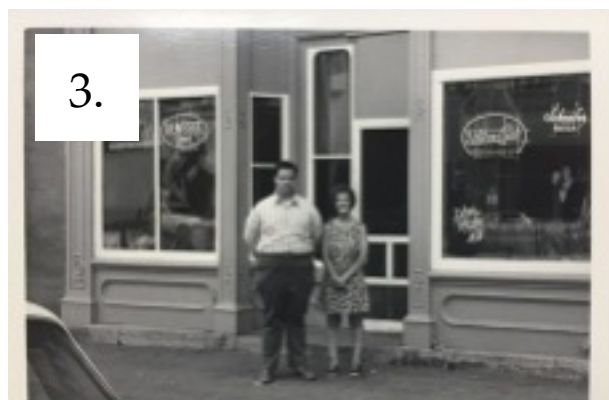

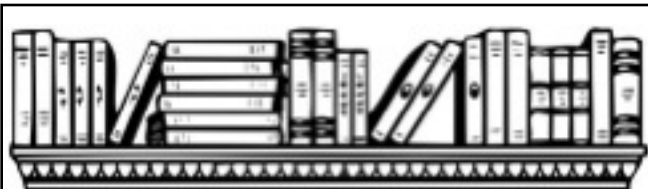
