Ganondagan State Historic Site in Victor, NY is a National Historic Landmark, and the only New York State Historic Site dedicated to a Native American theme.

The Seneca Art & Culture Center at Ganondagan (ga·NON·da·gan) tells the story of Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) contributions to our modern understanding of equality, democratic government, women's rights, ecology and natural foods.

The New York State Legislature was established in 1777. The Legislature is comprised of two houses, the Assembly and the Senate, both of which have co-equal powers. These two houses have the power to make all laws in all areas of the state except those that have been reserved to the federal government or to the people.
